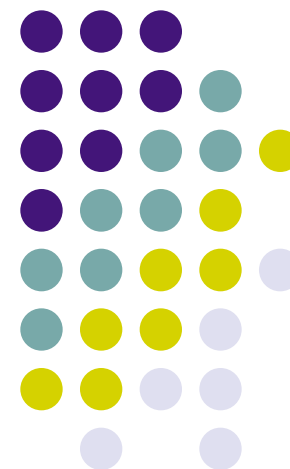


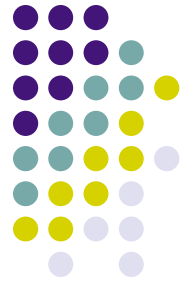


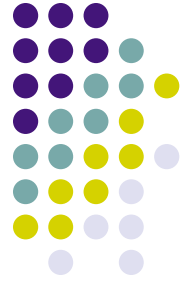

- Prohibition





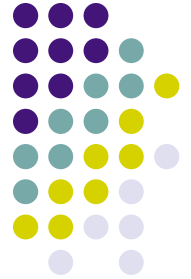
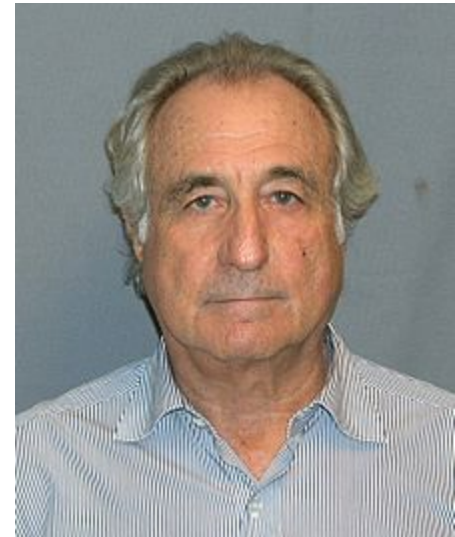
