- The purpose of the Cartilla Nacional de Salud (CNS) is part of an overall plan issued by the Federation and State Health Services to ensure that there is a promotion and prevention package available to the public through the use of these booklets. It is also to reduce the effects of families and individuals having delayed treatment with updates of their vaccinations and health appointments.
- There are a total of five booklets distinguished as the following: children 0-9 years, teenagers 10-19 years, women 20-59 years, men 20-59 years, and adults 60 years and older. Every single booklet also consists of seven sections, each detailing information or dates that assist the individuals in understanding their own health. Those sections are identification card, health promotion, nutrition, immunization schedule, detection, prevention and disease control, reproductive health, and medical appointment registrar

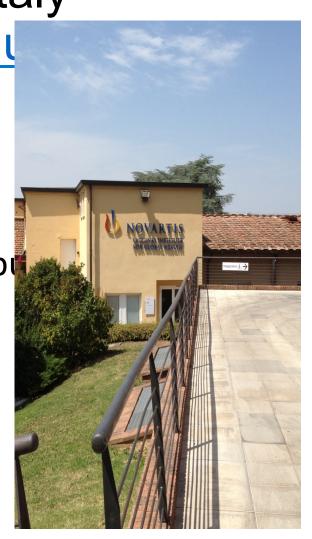
