

DATA PROFILE: NEW JERSEY

New Jersey is a Northeast Coast state with 21 counties. According to the United States American Community Survey (ACS) 2014-2018 five-year estimates, the total population of the state of New Jersey was approximately 8,881,845, making it the 11th most populous state in the U.S. The state had a density of 1,208 people per square mile.

Demographics

In New Jersey, 67.9% of the total population was White, 13.5% was Black or African American, 9.4% was Asian, 0.2% was Native American, and less than 0.01% was



Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander (3,357 individuals total).

Of the total population, 19.9% was Hispanic or Latino of any race. The median age of the total population was 39.8 years old. The population of people 25 years of age and older in New Jersey was 6,129,542. Of that population, 37.9% had a high school diploma/equivalent or

less, and 38.9% had a bachelor's degree or higher. Comparatively, of the United States population of people 25 years and older, 39.5% had a high school diploma/equivalent or less, and 31.5% had a bachelor's degree or higher.
